MEN'S HOME PROGRAM OVERVIEW

PASTOR STANLEY RIDLEY - EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Our mission is to provide youth, adults, and families with an effective and comprehensive Christian faith-based solution to life-controlling drug and alcohol problems in order to become productive members of society.

By applying biblical principals, New Life For Youth endeavors to help people become mentally sound, emotionally balanced, socially adjusted, physically well, and spiritually alive.

New Life Men's Home is a 12-18 month residential drug and alcohol program.

Gang member, heroin addict, lost soul - a miracle of "Hope" awaits you.

New Life will accept anyone that is struggling with drugs, alcohol or any life controlling problems.

The criteria for entry is very minimal but there must be a serious desire to change.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

The Intake Coordinator will arrange an intake day and time. Upon arrival you will be checked into the dorm and meet with a staff member to complete the necessary entrance forms. All belongings will be thoroughly checked to make sure you have only what is allowed as mentioned on the Admission Information Sheet, which you will have received with your application.



CURRENTLY INCARCERATED ?

If you are currently incarcerated (in jail or prison) obtain our manual and read it thoroughly, fill it out, and return it to us.

This can usually be done through your legal counsel or chaplain. We will then contact your probation or parole officer to discuss your eligibility for our program.

At this time you will also be checked to make sure that you are not carrying contraband on your person. A brief phone call will then be permitted to your family to let them know that you have arrived safely.

COSTS

There is a non-refundable induction fee of \$300 (payable by cash or money order) to be paid upon your arrival. The program is largely dependent on the free will offerings of concerned individuals to meet daily costs.

TELEPHONE INTERVIEW

Please call our intake office Monday thru Friday, 9AM - 5PM. One of our staff member will be glad to help you fill out an application over the phone. Please be sure to have read our Program Manual, if received, before calling, this will help you to better understand our program structure. You will then be considered for possible entrance into the program.

MAIL, ONLINE or FAX

If you choose to apply online, or have received an application by mail, read our manual thoroughly, fill out the application and send it back to us. We will then call you to arrange a time for a telephone interview. If you are applying online, please be sure to call our office to let us know that this is how you have applied.

Program Phases

MEN'S HOME PROGRAM PHASE OUTLINE

The Program

New Life For Youth operates a four-phase Christian growth program with an optional fifth phase for those going into ministry training. We have found that our current program with these months of training, has been the most effective way to help the student and meet their needs.

PHASE 1 – INDUCTION/ORIENTATION:

The orientation phase is a minimum of 30 days. This includes a probationary period of one month for the student to adjust to the residential and structured nature of the program. This is a trial period and at the end of these 30 days, there will be an evaluation by the Director as to your progress. A decision will be made at this time whether you will proceed.

PHASE 2 – TRAINING PART 1:

The first part of the training involves a minimum of 3 months with discipleship, teaching (individual and group), vocational training, Bible studies, Chapel services, recreation, etc.

To complete this phase, you will be expected to follow instructions, have a teachable attitude and have respect for people around you.

PHASE 3 – TRAINING PART II:

The purpose of this three month phase is to prepare the student for a successful return to society, by helping students learn to face everyday stresses and problems appropriately, and to show continued growth and stability. Each individual receives vocational and academic training, discipleship, training in life skills, and community involvement.

To complete this phase you will be showing that you can:

- accept personal responsibility
- make wise choices
- be self-motivated
- show initiative
- have tangible goals for the future
- complete the academic goals for this phase
- demonstrate the ability to apply and live out the principles that have been learned in the program

PHASE 4 – RE-ENTRY:

During the last month prior to the completion of phase 3, the student was assessed and plans were made for the type of re-entry program most beneficial for the student. Each re-entry program is unique and is designed to fit the student's specific needs. The Dean of Students or Director will assist you in your re-entry plans. Some examples of re-entry may be: employment, school, apply for an internship at a New Life For Youth Center
